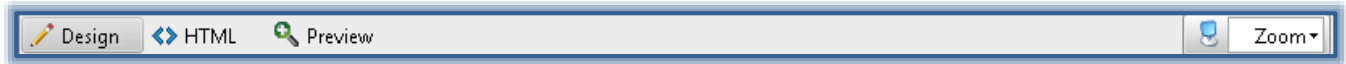


Text Wrap With an Image

After loading an image or picture with the Insert an Image tool within a Text/Multimedia-type item, you may notice that any text (new or old) will move underneath the picture. If you would like the text to wrap around or stay right next to the picture, edit the item using the HTML view.

- ✚ Click on the **HTML** button at the bottom of the text box.



- ✚ Find the code for the image.
 - ✳ It will have **.gif** or **.jpg**, or another picture extension next to it.
 - ✳ It will be surrounded by carrots (< and >) such as this:
.
- ✚ After the quotation mark on the right side of the .gif (etc.) place a space and then the words: **align=left**, just like this:
 - ✳ .
- ✚ Toggle back to the **Design** view to see what has happened with the text and the picture.
 - ✳ If the changes are satisfactory, click the **Save Changes** button.
 - ✳ If the changes are not satisfactory, toggle back and try something different, like align=right or align=center, or take the image out all together.
