
## **CREATE LINKS-HYPERLINKS TO IMAGES**

Links are used to allow visitors to the site access to another page or file on your site or on another site. Items can be linked to either text or images.

## **IMAGE LINKS**

Any image on the Web site can be turned into a link.

† Click the image that is to be used for the link.



- The **Replace Image Panel** will display (see illustration below).
- Click the Link button.
- The **Link** dialog box will display as shown in the illustration above.
- Select the type of **Link** that is to be created.
  - Website URL This option will create a link to another Web site. You have to insert the URL/Address for the site that is being linked to. Click the **Open link in new window** option if the site is not to open within your Web site.
  - Standard Page This option is used to link to a specified page of your Web site. Click the list arrow to select the page to link to.
  - Product Page If the site contains information regarding products available on the site, this option will insert a link to that product.
  - Blog Post To link to a blog in your site, select this option. A list of blogs will display.
    Select from one of the blogs.
  - **Phone** This option allows you to create a link to a specified phone number.
  - File Use this option to link to a file that has been uploaded to the Web site. If the file is not in the list, click the **Upload New** link to select the file.
  - Email Address To create a link to your Email Address select this option.
- When the options have been chosen, click away from the text area to apply the link.
- To test the link, you need to **Publish** the site.

## NOTE:

- When the Email link is used, the visitor's mail program (Like Apple Mail or Outlook) will open directly so the visitor can write a message.
- ♣ If the visitor is not using one of these programs the link won't work.
- † This is a browser issue, not a Weebly issue with links.
- The visitor will have to copy your email address or use a Contact Form if one has been added to the site.
